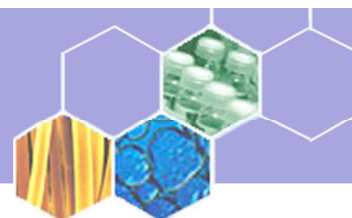

Drug Group	Effects	Examples of drugs tested & their street name
Amphetamines	Stimulant	Amphetamine or Dexedrine, (<i>“speed”, “upper”, “whiz”, “sulph”</i>) or MDA (<i>“love drug”</i>)
Meth-Amphetamines	Stimulant	Methamphetamine (<i>“crystal meth”</i>), MDMA (<i>“ecstasy”, “adam”</i>) or MDEA (<i>“eve”</i>).
Barbiturates	Sedative, anticonvulsants, anaesthetics or hypnotics	Amobarbitone, Butobarbitone, Hexobarbitone, Pentobarbitone, Phenobarbitone, Quinalbarbitone, Secobarbitone (<i>“sleepers”, “barbies”, “pink ladies”</i>)
Benzodiazepine	Anti-depressants or tranquilisers	Diazepam or Valium, Oxazepam, Temazepam, Chlordiazepoxide, Desmethyl-diazepam or Nordiazepam, Lorazepam
Cannabis	The botanical name for the plant from which marijuana comes.	THC (<i>“Hash”, “Skunk”, “Marijuana”</i>)
Cocaine	Stimulant	Cocaine: (<i>“charlie”, “coke”, “dust”</i>) Crack: (<i>“base”, “gravel”, “rocks”, “stones”</i>)
Methadone	A synthetic opiate used to treat heroin addiction	Methadone & EDDP (a metabolite of methadone)
Buprenorphine	Natural or synthetic derivatives of opium with analgesic (pain killer) and sedative effects.	Subutex (trade name)
Opiates	Natural or synthetic derivatives of opium with analgesic (pain killer) and sedative effects	Heroin (which is Diacetylmorphine) Morphine, Codeine, Dihydrocodeine,
Ketamine	Hallucinogenic and anaesthetic used in veterinary medicine	Ketamine and Norketamine (a metabolite of Ketamine)
